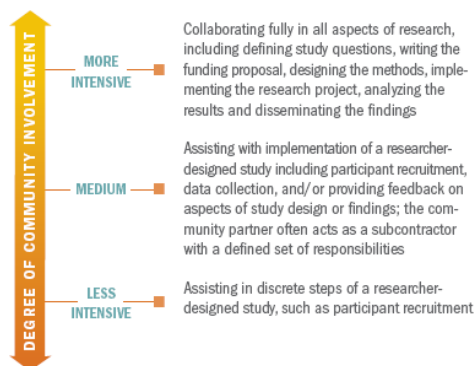


Community Engagement in the Research Process

Community-Based Participatory Research (CBPR)
